Pads

Pads are rectangles of absorbent material that come in a variety of sizes, from normal, long to night. Some have wings for extra security. And all come with a sticky backing strip that holds onto underwear so they don't move around. They have different absorption capacity and pads that you can use at night, which are longer.

Tampons

Tampons are period products that are worn inside the vagina, they all come with a string that hangs outside the body for removal.

There are two types of tampons; applicator and non-applicator.

Non-applicator tampons are guided into place by using your fingers. Applicator tampons come with a plastic or cardboard tube that you use instead of your fingers, the tubes help push the tampon into place.

They come in a variety of absorbencies and every pack of tampons carries full instructions for use and important health and safety information.

Panty liners

These are just like pads but thinner and smaller. They can be used to help capture discharge, keep you feeling clean and fresh, or on very light days of your period, usually at the beginning or end.

Period pants

Reusable pants come with extra absorbent layers in the gusset section. They can be rinsed and washed in cold water and reused again and again.

Menstrual cup

Just like tampons menstrual cups collect fluid from inside the body. They can be worn for 4-8 hours before emptying, cleaning and then reinserting. They are made of a soft silicone making them easy to insert and remove.
